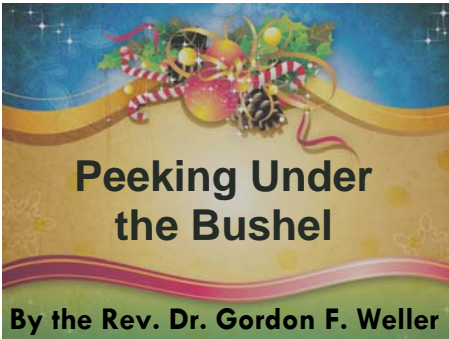

A day or so later and given some time for reflection, I've come to some conclusions which I share with you. One, I should be peeking under a few more bushels. So, watch out, I'll be doing some bushel tipping this year.

Musical preparations for Christmas are taking place at St. Paul's this Advent.

- On Friday, December 12, The Men of Orpheus will present its annual Christmas Concert. Directed by former parishioner Gayle Pohl, this group of men will perform a wide variety of Christmas music, sacred and secular. The concert begins at 7 p.m. and tickets will be available at the door.
- Saturday, December 18, The Lange Choral Ensemble will present its annual Christmas Concert. The program will include works by G. P. Telemann, Rene Clausen, Bob Chilcott, and others. They will be accompanied by organ and a small instrumental ensemble. The concert will begin at 7 p.m. and tickets (\$10 for adults and \$8 for seniors and students) will be available at the door.
- And finally, St. Paul's will present its usual Service of Advent Lessons and Carols on Sunday, December 19, at the 10 a.m. service. All of St. Paul's Choirs, including the Cherubs, Boys' and Grace Choirs, High School Choir, and Chancel Choir, will sing at this service that features readings and anthems appropriate to the seasons of Advent and Christmas.

# Swahili and English as Your Third Language?

Yes, plus reading, writing and arithmetic! That's the curriculum a Sudanese primary school child faces. For eight years, members of St. Paul's have been helping young Sudanese go to school. This past year, we contributed to the education of 10 students, siblings and relatives of the Sudanese refugees (a.k.a., "Lost Boys") who came to Lansing and St. Paul's for help in starting a new life in America early in this decade.

This year we would like to increase the grants from \$600 to \$700 which still covers less than half of the typical cost of a year's schooling, the rest of the bill being paid by each student's local grant applicant. One local applicant, who received two grants for the 2010 school year, is currently supporting six students for rent, food, uniforms, books, and instruction costs.

You will be receiving or have already received a letter asking you to support this program for 2011. The Sudanese Student Education Fund is one of St. Paul's responses to the Millennium Development Goals. Please help.

## Bringing Mayberry to St. Paul's

Jesus used parables to teach many of his lessons. Like parables, many of life's lessons can be learned through various media, so why not an "Andy Griffith" episode, right? On October 31, the church school classes gathered to watch the episode "Opie and the Spoiled Kid" using a lesson plan from BarneyFife.com, a biblical reference that uses episodes of "The Andy Griffith Show" as a teaching tool.

Using the small town atmosphere of Mayberry and its likable citizens, basic values such as character, personal responsibility, honesty and integrity were routinely exemplified in the show. In "Opie and the Spoiled Kid," Opie learns the value of receiving spiritual rather than material rewards (1 Cor. 3:8); of changing focus from himself to others (Luke 10:30-37); and the reasons for honoring authority (Eph. 6:1).

Many of the students had never seen an episode of "The Andy Griffith Show," but it was clear that the message rang through by their enthusiastic discussion led by **Lyn Kressler**. All agreed that the spoiled boy Arnold was the less fortunate one in the end.

# TREASURER'S REPORT

## Financial Information as of October, 2010

Pledge income in October was \$27,400. This brings year-to-date total pledge income to \$249,040, which is 75% of the annual budget amount. We are 83% of the way through the year, so it appears as if we may be falling a bit further behind in pledge collection.

Operations for October had a net loss of \$1,738. No transfers were required from the investment account into the operating account during October. The investment accounts/funds had a net gain of \$15,079 for the month.

It should be noted that, at the time of printing, Fr. Weller has repaid the loan made to him by the Church in full. This will be reflected in the November financial statements.
