Save the Date! BCP Class in April In response to many requests and also a promise, the two-week class on The Book of Common Prayer will be offered on two consecutive Wednesdays in April – the 20th and 27th. Mark these two dates on your calendar.

Our Lenten Series continues in **March on Wednesday evenings**. Utilizing the wonderful materials generated from the 2016 Trinity Institute series, we will continue our conversation on Racial Justice.

On **March 2nd** we will look at Reparation and Racial Justice – it is a challenge to consider the concept of 'Reparation" without fear and the immediate response of 'how large a check must I write?' Jennifer Harvey provides us a way to have this conversation.

On **March gth** we will have conversations around Theology and Racial Justice utilizing materials produced by Dr. J. Kameron Carter. Dr. Carter suggests that the journey toward racial justice cannot be fully undertaken without a grasp of the theological implications underlying both its origins and development.

Our final class on **March 16th** will provide us with an opportunity to have conversations on Racism and Racial Justice. Duke University professor Eduardo Bonilla-Silva suggests a new type of racism has taken hold of American society that's subtle, persistent, and dangerous. Please know that if you cannot attend all three, you are welcome to join us for whichever ones you are able to fit into your schedule.

Bible Study Sunday evenings at 6:30 pm on March 13th. All are welcome as we continue our study of I and II Thessalonians.

Lenten Book Reviews Four Mondays in February and March

St. Paul's is continuing its tradition of Lenten luncheon book reviews this year on four Mondays in February and March. Lunch will be at noon (\$7), with the reviews from **12:30 pm to 1:00 pm**. You should sign up in the Merrifield Room if you plan to eat so we can get an accurate count for food. You are welcome to bring your own lunch. There is no need to sign up if you are not eating but just showing up for the review. Here are the remaining reviews in the series:

March 7 – Sue LeDuc reviews the *Secret Chord: A Novel* by Geraldine Brooks, a novel about the life of King David. The publishers say that "Brooks takes on one of literature's richest and most enigmatic figures: a man who shimmers between history and legend. Peeling away the myth to bring David to life in Second Iron Age Israel, Brooks traces the arc of his journey from obscurity to fame, from shepherd to soldier, from hero to traitor, from beloved king to murderous despot and into his remorseful and diminished dotage."

March 14 – Mark Rudd reviews *The New Jim Crow- Mass Incarceration in the Age of Colorblindness* by Michelle Alexander. According to Mark, Professor Alexander makes a strong case that the War on Drugs, specifically targeting black men, has led to their mass incarceration and relegated millions to a permanent second-class status, thus decimating communities of color. She argues that the U.S. criminal justice system functions as a modern system of racial control- a new Jim Crow. In keeping with our theme this year at St. Paul's of learning about and addressing issues of race, this is an especially important message to hear.

Vestry Highlights

February 15, 2016 Meeting

- Brief orientation given to the new members of Vestry: Keeli Baker, Jim Milne & Larissa Clark.
- Karen+ updated the vestry on the progress of our re-vamped sound system with the hope it will be completed before Easter. The mother of one of the installers recently entered hospice care.
- Vestry discussed next steps with Asset Mapping and laid out their thoughts and concerns regarding the timing of the implementation of this process.
- Discussed continuation of the pledge drive and contacting those who have not yet pledged. A letter and pledge card will be mailed to those folks from Karen+.
- After much discussion and a commitment to have a balanced budget by the end of 2016, the Vestry voted to accept the 2016 Budget with a deficit of approximately \$33,000 (although this is expected to be reduced by an estimated \$8,000-\$10,000 in anticipated additional pledges). To increase revenue, a Fund Raising Task Force was created and also a Pledge Drive Task Force.
- Vestry received an update on the bathroom remodeling project. A parishioner has volunteered to pay for a contractor to assist in completing the tasks.

We have received an estimate and we need to decide which tasks on the estimate can be accomplished by parish volunteers in an effort to lower the cost of the entire project.

- Vestry received the completed Audit Report for 2014 and gave its thanks to Brad Deacon, Kirk Lindquist, Libby Richardson, Jeff Irwin and Theresa Milne for their hard work in completing this report.
- Vestry gave its annual approval/commitment to supporting the Diocesan Sexual Conduct Policy.
- Vestry appointed Sally Lawrence as the third lay delegate to the 2016 Diocesan Convention.
- Vestry appointed the members to the new Investment Committee. The Treasurer and Rector are standing members of this committee. Additional members were appointed for the following terms: Jim Huber, 3-year term; Kirk Lindquist, 2-year term; Lyn Zynda, 1-year term.
- Vestry members selected the parish committees on which they will serve as liaisons in 2016 to maintain communications.
- Vestry will gather on Saturday, February 27th from 10 am 3 pm for retreat and planning.

Are you Prepared for an Emergency?

Emergencies are never expected. They occur suddenly. They can be very upsetting. Do you know what to do? Can you use an AED? Have you learned how to do CPR? Do you know how to stop severe bleeding? Trained responders can assist calmly. Become one! Sign up to take a class. See separate information in the SPN for a class on April 23.

St. Paul's is continuing its relationship with the American Red Cross as an Authorized Provider and can facilitate instruction of CPR, use of an AED, first aid skills including use of an Epi Pen. We have two AEDs in our facilities. We own our own manikins for teaching CPR. Red Cross and American Heart have recently updated their courses based on new science.

The best news is that St. Paul's now has TWO certified ARC instructors! We welcome Mark Rudd to our team. Mark is certified in CPR/AED/FA as a lay responder and is recently certified as an instructor. Mark brings with him experience as a volunteer firefighter. He will work with Sally Boron and transition to becoming the lead instructor. Sally has been an ARC volunteer instructor with Girl Scouts, schools, and the local ARC chapter for more than 25 years and will continue to assist.

CPR/AED/FA Class offering is April 23rd!

Are you currently certified? Persons who hold an unexpired CPR/AED/FA certificate need to renew every 2 years. We are prepared to teach a review class for you. Please let Mark or Sally know if you would like to have a Review class offered.

Reaching out to Maplewood!

Maplewood is a shelter for women and children located on South Cedar Street. It is a service of the City Rescue Mission. Homeless and needy women, many with children, can find refuge at Maplewood. Several years ago the St. Paul's Altar Guild began to collect toiletries for those in need. Since 2012 these collections have been given to Maplewood to help with personal care.

What is needed? Personal care amenities like the ones travelers find in their hotel room and/or small samples that can be purchased at grocery and drug stores are what are needed. Donations must be new and not opened. Examples include: soap, shampoo, lotion, hair conditioners, toothpaste, combs, deodorant, etc.

You can help also! There is a shopping bag on the Needs Table in the cloister were you may place your donations. When the bag is full, the contents are delivered to Maplewood as a gift from St. Paul's.

CPR/AED/First Aid Offering this Spring!

St. Paul's is a registered ARC Authorized Provider of health and safety classes and is privileged to have two instructors - Sally Boron and Mark Rudd.

TAKE A CLASS THIS SPRING!

Step 1 – Register - details listed below. A 330 fee is payable before the skill session. (Cost of the same class is 90 at the local Red Cross Chapter.)

Step 2 - Classes are condensed, computer driven and streamlined. Participants take the CPR, AED, and First Aid content on their own computer, at their own pace over a 2 week time frame. Individual differences will determine the time line for on line completion. Allow 2 - 5 hours total. Upon completion, the participant will receive an email certificate of completion.


Step 3 - An approximately $2 - 2 \frac{1}{2}$ hour hands on skill session with the instructors will complete American Red Cross certification requirements. At this session, skills are reviewed on video and demonstrated by instructors. Participants will practice the skills on manikins and with other materials.

Easter Scavenger Hunt


