
# THE FIRST LESSON

# THE GOSPELThe people standReaderThe Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see – I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

#### THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

We pray for public officials and rulers. Give them wisdom in decisions, a will for the common good, and the courage to work for peace among all nations. **Shine upon them and give them peace.** 

We pray for all who work and watch this night: for those in hospitals and positions of public service; for those serving our country here and around the globe; for those in airports, trains, and bus stations; for those who work in shelters, hotels, and other places of hospitality. **Shine upon them and give them peace.** 

We pray for all who suffer this night: those who are sick and those on our prayer list and who have requested our prayers; those we name either silently or aloud \_\_\_\_\_; for those who are cold, lonely or grieving; for people who are hungry and thirsty. **Shine upon them and give them peace.** 

We pray for families and friends; for those who are with us and those far away; for those who are traveling; for those who especially need your guidance in this season and for those in our memories who now dwell with you. **Shine upon them and give them peace.** 

We pray, O God, with the multitude of the heavenly host, that through Jesus Christ your glory will lighten every darkness; that your peace will fill all in all. We pray that those who live in the midst of war may live without fear and destruction; and that all your creatures may be restored and renewed. **Shine upon them and give them peace.** 

We pray for those who have died and those who mourn or struggle to celebrate this season of hope. We pray God will grant them the sure and certain knowledge we will one day be joined together in eternal life. **Shine upon them and give them peace.**

The grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all. As we celebrate his birth, and wait in hope for his coming again, receive our prayers and the prayers of our hearts through the power of the Holy Spirit, in Jesus' name we pray. **Amen.**




## THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

Recalling his death and resurrection, and longing for his coming in glory we offer you these gifts of bread and wine, and our lives in thanks and praise.




